Austin Free-Net, which has established 92 Public Computer Centers (PCCs) across 17 Texas counties and has impacted over 1 million users to-date. By providing access to computers with high-speed internet plus free digital literacy training, the Texas Connects Coalition is eliminating barriers to education and making a positive impact on the economy.

Since 1997, Technology For All has been working to empower low-income and under-resourced communities through the tools of technology. TFA also operates an innovative broadband wireless network with Rice University that serves the community around its office in Houston, Texas.
